

Romania some facts

- Largest of the Balkan countries
- Population 21m
- Romania, a slower developer than other former communist countries of eastern Europe, took a major step away from its past when it was one of seven countries to join NATO in late March 2004
- Joined the EU in 2007
- Romania was hit hard in the 2008 Financial crisis.
 Recovery has been slow with harsh austerity measures taken by government and a 20bn IMF bailout. The largest bailout given.



























Why Romania?

- Very strong position (Centre of three important pan-European corridors with access to the Black Sea and Asia)
- Cost-effective alternative
- An expanding economy
- The working-age population in Romania tends to be very welleducated with strong foreign language skills more than 50,000 specialists in engineering
- Good support from local government and universities
- A willing and available work force

























Why Romania?

- Low tax burden; complex system of tax incentives corporate income and capital gains taxes at 16% and value-added tax (VAT) at 20%.
- EU Cohesion Policy funding 23 billion EUR endowment, available for the period of 2014 to 2020
- Access to EU Funds, Horizont 2020, Regional Operational Program (ROP), Operational Programme Competitiveness (OPC), Human Capital Operational Programme (HCOP)
- Low Labor rates 250 euro per month
- Low rents
- Low Energy costs 5 euro cents /Kwhr





















Why are we moving production to a low cost base country for **PCB production**

- Spirit Circuits manufacture PCBs in the 1 6 layer technology range which tend to be more price sensitive
- We have a dominance in the LED sector and have a high demand for S/S PCBs
- China costs are increasing everywhere, hotels, salaries, food
- There is a reluctance in China to supply S/S PCBs
- We have failed to get the quality we want from India
- To be competitive we need to use sea freight from China adding 5 weeks to the lead time
- Our customers are all in Europe
- Real estate, utilities and labour are too expensive in the UK
- Constantly threatened by changes beyond our control when trading in China












Costs of freight by air












Unemployment reaches new low levels



Unemployment levels have been relatively stable during the crisis years. Romania's unemployment rate has been hovering around 7% for a long period. Then the labor market has started to show signs of improvement in 2013-2015 and unemployment has become to descend to levels close to an average of 5.4%.












Average hours of worked by employees per year





With 2,100 average hours worked by employees per year, Romania ranks first in Europe as the hardest working nation. Productivity per hour worked remains low at 45.1 compared to Slovakia (76.5), Hungary (61.5), Czech Rep. (66.6), Poland (59.9). Bulgaria lags behind with a productivity of 43.2.


























Fastest growing GDP in CEE


